In this four session series, presented by the Princeton Public Library and Not In Our Town, a local interfaith, interracial social action group, facilitators Sarah Halley, Ann Yasuhara and Pamela Freeman will explore the meaning of “white privilege”. Using video, audio and reading material and facilitated discussions, they will help participants discover how, in their roles as individuals and leaders, they can be part of solving problems that arise because of white privilege.

The first session will focus on notions of identity and privilege. The next two sessions will consider ways that white privilege hurts not only people of color, but also white people. Building on the consciousness raised and the understanding acquired, the final session will engage participants in considering how they can open their hearts to incorporate into their life’s work an active confrontation of racism.

Sources will include *Unpacking the Backpack of White Privilege* by Peggy McIntosh, *Learning to be White* by Thaneka, *White Like Me* by Tim Wise, and the video *Mirrors of Privilege*.
